2020 State Record Set

Barron Electric Cooperative's 84th Annual Meeting on August 20 set a state record for attendance with 621 members and guests. Cooperatives adjusted their annual meetings in 2020 due to the pandemic. Attendance, of course, has been down considerably despite these adjustments with approximately 100 members attending a drive-in style meeting.
