Switching to paperless billing and AutoPay can save money for all members!
See how the savings can add up!

- 1,845 of 18,735 Barron Electric accounts are currently enrolled in paperless billing.
- That is 9.8% of our total membership.
- For every one ton of paper recycled, 4,077 kilowatt hours of electricity are saved.
- If all accounts went paperless, it would save roughly 12,660 pounds of paper each year.
- It costs Barron Electric approximately \$.70 to create and mail one paper bill each month.
- If all members switched to paperless billing, it would save Barron Electric and its members more than \$165,672 per year!

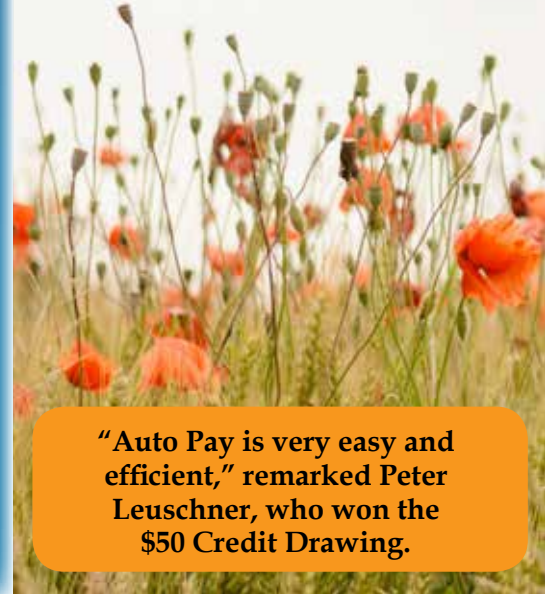

Condensed Board Minutes

May 29, 2019



- Director Helm gave the treasurer's report, with comments by Manager Sloan. A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #96107 thru #96229 of CCF Bank was in the amount of \$560,056 and capital credit estate checks of \$10,947. Director Helm reported on activity of total receipts in the office - \$3,217,718; total receipts by wire and ACH - \$1,756,301; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire - \$4,048,326; transfer of funds was made for payroll - \$189,559 and power bill paid 05/29/19 in the amount of \$1,881,240.
- Form 219 summarizing construction activity for the past month in the amount of \$221,971.09 was presented for approval, and included new services - (\$358.63) change jobs - \$778.40; miscellaneous - \$225,551.32 and 1 retirement. The Form 219 stood approved as presented.
