Over 14,000 members and former members will share in more than \$900,000. Retirement amounts under \$10 for active members will be applied to member's billing accounts in October. Members eligible for a cashback credit check will receive a postcard in September. Checks will be available at Cooperative Month events on October 3 and October 5.

Barron Electric Cooperative is currently building a new substation just north of the Walmart Supercenter to help with increased load in that area. North Wal Substation will alleviate load from the Haugen, Cameron, and Barron Substations. Dairyland Power Cooperative, Barron Electric's wholesale power supplier, will build the transmission line to North Wal Substation. Dairyland Power generates electricity using both traditional and renewable energy resources to provide safe, reliable, and affordable energy.

Barron Electric is working with Substation Services, McDonald Construction, Bull Dozin,' Inc., Antczak Construction, Inc., and Dairyland Power Cooperative to complete the project.



Construction has started on the North Wal Substation, located just north of the Walmart Supercenter.



*Condensed Board Minutes

June 28, 2023

Patricia Mandel represents District 6 on Barron Electric's Board of Directors which includes the townships of Clinton, Barron, Maple Grove, and Prairie Lake.



- A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #101837 through #101951 from CCF Bank in the amount of \$631,178 and capital credit estate checks in the amount of \$13,898. Total receipts in the office - \$2,172,673; total receipts by wire and ACH - \$1,177,229; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire - \$2,294,640; transfer of funds was made for payroll - \$220,783 and power bill paid on June 28, 2023, in the amount of \$1,789,240.
- A membership list of 64 was presented and accepted without objection.
- Inventory of Work Orders summarizing construction activity for the month of May in the amount of \$330,076.86 was presented for approval and included new services
 \$35,730.63; change jobs - \$41,383.56; Other Work Order Projects - \$252,962.67 and 2 retirements. The Inventory of Work Orders stood approved as presented.
- Outages year-to-date stand at 11,030.38 consumer hours off, which is 72.79% below 2022 hours of 40,532.38. Overtime year-to-date is 902.25 hours, which is 7.67% below 2022 hours of 977.25.
