



### **MISO Predicts Power Shortages this Summer**

Dairyland Power Cooperative, Barron Electric's wholesale power supplier, is a member of the Midcontinent Independent System Operator (MISO), an independent, not-for-profit organization responsible for operating the power grid in 15 states and Manitoba,



MISO oversees the regional power grid, including the four states Dairyland Power serves including Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, and Illinois.

Canada. MISO predicts power shortages this summer during times of peak demand due to two predominant factors: the increase in electricity use as the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic ease and the retirement of generators has been faster than the pace of adding

new energy resources. New generation resources being built are intermittent wind and solar, which are not always available when needed.

Zak Joundi, MISO's Executive Director, recently stated, "MISO's northern and central regions are at heightened risk for controlled load sheds or planned blackouts." MISO may activate emergency plans, which would result in load shedding (reducing the demand for electricity) outside of seasonal full

load control hours (2 p.m. to 6 p.m., in the summer). If the power grid is nearing capacity, members will be asked to begin conservation measures such as limiting the use of air conditioning. Members should also delay the use of dishwashers, washers and dryers and other nonessential electricity items. These measures take some pressure off the grid to help keep the lights on and help avoid blackouts. Cooperative members who depend on electricity for oxygen or other life-sustaining medical equipment should have a plan in case of a power outage. Owning a backup generator can provide peace of mind.

In addition, the Energy Information Administration forecasts higher electricity prices this summer due to the increase of natural gas prices as well as an increased demand after COVID. Due to these factors, members will likely see power cost adjustments.



#### **BLT Pasta Salad**

2 cups pasta farfelle uncooked3 cups Romaine lettuce chopped3/4 cup red onion chopped1 cup tomatoes chopped4 slices bacon cooked and crumbled

1/4 cup ranch dressing
1/4 cup plain Greek yogurt
1/4 cup mayonnaise
1 T. red wine vinegar
Salt and pepper to taste

- 1. Cook pasta. Meanwhile prepare the rest of the salad.
- 2. In large bowl, add tomatoes, lettuce, bacon, and red onion.
- 3. In small bowl, mix ranch, yogurt, mayonnaise, vinegar and pepper. Mix well.

### \*Condensed Board Minutes March 30, 2022



Mike Baker, Vice President of Barron Electric's Board of Directors, represents District 3, which includes the following townships: Crystal, Stone Lake, Sand Lake, Beaverbrook, Madge, Birchwood, Sarona, and Cedar Lake.

- The minutes of the 86th Annual Meeting, March 26, 2022, were approved as written.
- Director Kessler gave the treasurer's report, with comments by General Manager Torud. A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #99985 thru #100086 of CCF Bank in the amount of \$136,417 and capital credit estate checks in the amount of

\$15,200. Director Kessler reported on activity of total receipts in the office - \$3,317,223; total receipts by wire and ACH - \$3,187,746; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire - \$6,055,803; transfer of funds was made for payroll - \$187,099 and power bill paid 03/30/2022 in the amount of \$2,489,433.

- A membership list of 40 was presented and approved without objection by the board.
- Form 219 summarizing construction activity for the month of February in the amount of \$107,430.77 was presented for approval and included new services \$3,722.43; change jobs \$0; Other Work Order Projects \$103,708.34 and 9 retirements. The Form 219 stood approved as presented.
- Outages year-to-date stand at 3,400 consumer hours off, which is 110.9% above 2021 hours of 1,612. Overtime year-to-date is 193.75 hours, which is 29.17% above 2021 hours of 150.00.
