

## \*Condensed Board Minutes November 24, 2021

Bill Effertz serves on Barron Electric's Board of Directors and represents District 8, which includes the townships of Crystal Lake, Almena, Clayton, Turtle Lake, Arland, Clear Lake, Vance Creek, Prairie Farm, New Haven, and Sheridan.



- Director Kessler gave the treasurer's report, with comments by General Manager Torud. A report of vouchers for the month was presented as part of the board packet as follows: #99572 thru #99690 of CCF Bank was in the amount of \$174,887 and capital credit estate checks in the amount of \$11,239. Director Kessler reported on activity of total receipts in the office - \$2,101,491; total receipts by wire and ACH - \$478,200; disbursements by ACH, EFT, wire - \$2,177,080; transfer of funds was made for payroll - \$185,030 and power bill paid 11/24/2021 in the amount of \$1,480,176.
- A membership list of 64 was presented and approved without objection by the board.
- Outages year-to-date stand at 39,359 consumer hours off, which is 52.59% below 2020 hours of 83,018. Overtime year-to-date is 3,010.75 hours, which is 2.56% below 2020 hours of 3,090.00.
